# Reports of 'Breakthrough' COVID Cases After Vaccine

A small number of people have tested positive for COVID-19 more than two weeks after being fully vaccinated, which is also known as a "breakthrough" case. Oregon has also reported a handful of breakthrough cases, according to an Oregon Health Authority statement. Four cases had been identified by mid-February, and all had mild or no symptoms.

"Such cases are not unexpected," according to the statement. "Clinical trials of both vaccines presently in use included breakthrough cases." Even so, vaccines reduced the severity of illness, the statement said. The same types of breakthrough cases happen with other diseases and vaccines as well, such as the flu.

Breakthrough cases provide a reminder for people to continue to take precautions against the coronavirus as they get vaccinations this year, CBS Minnesota reported. "You still need to mask; you still need to make sure you're socially distancing.
